

# From the Editor

hen I was handed a bottle of scotch from the nine other NHFL GMs on that cottage deck in Muskoka, I couldn't have been more honoured. As I'm sure most of my followers disciples countless are aware, my accomplishments and awards tend to hog the spotlight, and it's my dedication to, and success in, this league - as both a GM and the Commissioner - that is very often overlooked (that, and my incredible track record with the fairer sex), so it was liberating to finally receive some measure of praise for the massive amounts of effort I put in to elevate the NHFL to its certified legendary status.

I kid, of course. I truly could not have been more humbled at that moment, surrounded by that group of exceptional and passionate friends. That's why you're reading this right now - that's the flow that makes this league go: we're all passionate about the NHFL. We all enjoy the reprieve from reality that it offers, where we get to live out our fantasties of being professional hockey management executives. The Fifty Mission Cup is more than just an accolade - it's a year-long bragging right that one guy gets and nine guys (and now eleven, with expansion) desperately want. We get out of this league what we put in, and we all put in a lot.

Reflecting on this past season makes me puke in my mouth because Evo won for a third time. Was it well deserved? I guess. Did he fluke his way to anything? Not really, I suppose. Now only 50% of the league will have a shot at the Fifty Mission Cup every year. This is going to get heated. This is going to up the competition level. This is gonna get *real* good.

I've got to mention the outstanding job Marty did in hosting the 2017 draft. You certainly put the pressure on your successors for that role, because it truly was an event to remember. I am sure Chris is losing sleep over thinking about how to maintain the high standard you've set for his turn as draft host in Ottawa this fall.

ell done - you've finally accomplished something in your life. And this isn't just any old accomplishment. This isn't something lame and stupid that anyone can do like purchasing your first car, getting married or delving into home ownership. This is the NHFL. This is legit. People actually care about this.

#### This is the NHFL. You're big time now.

Prepare to research players and teams more than you ever have before. Eat, sleep, breathe, sh!t and masturbate NHFL. Shift league events to the top of your priority list. Sorry to miss your birthday party, daughter, but daddy has to get to a random Ontario (or US) town to draft his hockey team. Get rid of all your other friends. And be sure to hurl personal insults at them on their way out, because they are small potatoes compared to this. Your other fantasy "leagues" are the equivalent of taking guitar lessons from some hillbilly pedophile that lost 4 fingers in a cross-burning accident. The NHFL is the original Woodstock. Here's a crash course to help you avoid embarrassing yourself entirely - follow these simple guidelines and the trillions of adoring NHFL fans out there will love you, and more importantly, so too will the 10 NHFL GMs that built this titan of an organization.

#### 1. www.NHFL.ca

This cannot be overstated: NHFL.ca is life. It is the primary source for all your NHFL needs. The rule book league and player stats, keepers are posted there, the draft list and draft pick histories are posted there, captains/assistant captains, division and championship banners, jersey retirements, team histories. You curious about an aspect of league history? It's probably on NHFL.ca. If it isn't, let the Commissioner know, and it will

be. Don't worry, you'll learn to live with the perpetual erection you'll have as a side effect. If there is one thing to take away from NHFL.ca, it is this: the farm teams are posted on the home page. Before adding a player to your roster, check NHFL.ca to see if someone already has that player on their farm. There are penalties if you f\*\*k this up with any regularity. www.NHFL.ca. Set it as your homepage already, ffs.

#### 2. Respond to texts

There is an official rule in the rule book that outlines applicable punishment if someone consistently fails to respond to trade inquiries (see 5.1.6 in the Constitution and Rule Book on - SURPRISE - www.NHFL.ca). Be responsive. The league made 117 trades last year, and that didn't have been supported by the support of the sup microDOCKS all day long while someone was trying to reach out to make a trade, especially if the deal was time sensitive, like acquiring an extra goalie game on a Sunday, or needing to clear a roster spot before adding a player from the free agent list. Messages like this are going to come hot and heavy, and you'll be pissing everyone off if you're absent or unresponsive. Also, be active in the Yahoo! chat room. You'll quickly see how much use that room gets as soon as games start back up again. Don't be shy, it's more fun than anything else you've ever participated in your entire life.

#### 3. Making trades

Don't initiate trade negotiations by sending an offer on Yahoo! by itself. Always text, or call, or talk in person first. Even if the text is "I'm interested in smoking your pole. I'm going to send you a couple offers to start working on the details to make it happen." Remember, you've got a wide array of asset types that you are permitted to trade, including players, farm players, keeper spots, farm spots, draft picks and FAAB dollars.

#### 4. Set your roster

This is Gary. Gary fails to set his roster at some point every week. This results in Gary getting blown up in certain weeks, then deciding to show up for a few days, then getting blown up again, which totally screws with the standings. Playoff spots are decided every year by single digit points, and Gary is being an asshole by not setting his roster. Don't be a Gary. We had to snuff out Gary's life. Set your goddam roster.

#### 5. Talk that smack

Trash talk is a right of passage in the NHFL. Direct shots at kids are out-of-bounds, unless you're ripping someone for how sh!tty of a father they are. Always keep it light and never make it personal. If you have an issue with what someone said, direct message them and let them know that you feel that they crossed the line. Shake your dicks and end the pissing contest like men.

**6. It's more than fantasy hockey**There are a number of NHFL features that provide opportunities for each GM to be involved in the management and administration side of the league and their franchise, including: awards voting, captain and assistant captain designations, arena details, team uniforms, goalie masks and jersey retirements. The more you put into the league, the more you'll get out of it. Take an interest in the features that are offered, they are part of the differentiator between your old shithole leagues and the NHFL. Let's do that hockey.

General Managers cast their votes for who gets to take home the NHFL silverware. Do some players get overlooked in their relevant categories? Totally. But ultimately, the GMs get the finalists and winner right. Most of the time. And even when they don't, there's at least an argument to be made for the winner.



The league MVP is always a hotly contested accolade. This is an award that Alexander Ovechkin should be in contention for, every single season. In 2017-18, Ovechkin caputured his 7th Rocket Richard Trophy, and his 11th Shots-On-Goal crown, while provide also valuable contributions in powerplay points, game winning goals, and hits. This was the second time that Ovechkin appeared on the NHFL Award ballot as a Bar Down Trophy finalist. In his previous appearance in 2016, he was edged out by Art Ross Trophy winner Patrick Kane.

### THE BAR DOWN TROPHY THE BRETHREN AWARD



Though exceptional back-toback regular seasons didn't lead to Fifty Mission Cup glory for Funky Cold Molina, General Manager Michael Mesquita did not go home empty handed in 2018, as he captured the Brethren Award as GM of the Year, as voted on by his National Hockey Fantasy League peers. A well-deserved distinction, GM Mesquita guided the Funky Cold Molina to a near start-to-finish lead in the 2017-18 regular season standings, before being ousted in the playoffs - for the second consecutive post-season - by the eventual Fifty Mission Cup champion

#### THE HANSON DONNYBROOK TROPHY




For 3 weeks to close out the year, Anze Kopitar put Cerberus HC on his back and helped carry the franchise to its third ever Fifty Mission Cup title. netting six points (4 goals, 2 assists) in the championship week, alone. The performance earned him the 2018 Hanson Donnybrook Trophy as the National Hockey Fantasy League playoff MVP. ## THE BRODEUR TROPHY



Andrei Vasilevskiy burst into the spotlight in 2017-18 in a big way to capture his first Brodeur Trophy as the Top Goaltender in the National Hockey Fantasy League. In his first taste of an uncontested starters workload, Vasilevskiy won a league-high 44 games, and stopped 1908 shots on goal, which ranked 2nd in the entire league. His .920 save percentage was well above league average, and he managed to remain fairly consistent over the course of the NHFL regular season, with a 56% quality start percentage on the year. Vasilevskiy's win marked the second consecutive year in which a Funky Cold Molina goalie won top honours.

## THE LIDSTROM TROPHY THE SELANNE TROPHY



In a loaded field with no clear front runner, Roman Josi managed to collect just enough votes to home the 2018 Lidstrom Trophy as the Top Defenseman in the National Hockey Fantasy League. This was the closest vote among all trophy races this year, as Drew Doughty, Victor Hedman, P.K. Subban, John Klingberg and Brent Burns all had seasons worthy of the Lidstrom Award. With this award win, Funky Cold Molina joined the 2016 Cerberus HC squad as the only two franchises to roster three NHFL award winners in the same season (Holbty as top goalie, Panarin as top rookie, and Ouzounis as GMOTY)



Brock Boeser was plucked up by HC Haymos GM Michael Hayman in the 9th round of the 2017 draft. He was buried on their farm team to start the year. before bursting onto the scene and forcing his way into the National Hockey Fantasy League, scoring at a near-40goal clip, and locking down the Selanne Trophy as the 2018 NHFL Rookie of the Year. The future is indeed bright for the bruising rightwinger. Mr. Trade forward Mathew Barzal put up a solid fight, with Clayton Keller, Yanni Gourde, Nico Hischier and Alex DeBrincat also all having strong seasons and earning consideration for the top rookie honour.

## THE KAWAGAMA LAKE TROPHY



The 10th anniversary of the first National Hockey League Draft saw a number of excellent sleeper picks that paid huge dividends for teams in 2017-18. but the selection of Connor Hellebuyck with the third-to-last pick in the draft was voted as the leagues best in 2018. The combination of season success (Hellebuyck finished as the runner-up for the Brodeur Trophy) and the late pick used to acquire him was enough to easily lock up the trophy is a landslide vote, with no one else garnering consideration for the award from more than a single General Manager. This is the first award win for The White Stache HC franchise.

## THE MARTIN ST. LOUIS TROPHY



William Karlsson was plucked off the scrap heap by the Vegas Golden Knights in the 2017 NHL expansion draft, and went on to tear the league up, potted 43 goals and 78 points on the season. He was a catalyst to the success that the Golden Knights enjoyed in their inaugural season. And it was HC Haymos that plucked Karlsson off the NHFL scrap heap in November, just in time for his unexpected tear to start. The free agent add was chosen by the National Hockey Fantasy League GMs as the first winner of the Martin St. Louis Trophy as the top free agent add of the season.



The Traders' Cup was handed out to the General Manager that completed the most trades in Only two GMs 2017-18. legitimate emerged as contenders for this award, the Mr. Trade GM Jason White narrowly out-trading couterpart from Dick Cheese, GM Matthew Cheese, to earn the award. It is expected that tweaks will be made to the scoring system for determining who is awarded this trophy, so this may be the only time that it is handed out on the sole basis of total trades made. If that's the case, then it more than fitting that the one-time winner is the franchise that goes by the name of 'Mr. Trade'







## MOLINA VILLAGERS

## KFISHER KINGS

That is actually the The bad luck that plagued the Fisher Kings in 2017-18 can't possibly continue, right? RIGHT!? With Sidney Crosby, Erik Karlsson, Brent Burns, Braden Hollby and Connor McDavid all in tow, this is a team that is poised to overcome more bad luck should it rear it's ugly head, but there's even more reason for optimism in the form of five 1st round picks, including 3 of the first 4 selections. More reinforcements are right behind too, with 13 more selections in rounds 2 through 8. Flirting with contender status is an annual past time for the Fisher Kings, but this time they just might be the cream of the crop heading into the season - their veteran keepers are still producing at superstar levels, their goaltenders are above average on paper but will need to put their 2017-18 seasons behind them, and they're holding a full house of budding talent. Give the Fisher Kings the best odds at the 2019




## TORONTO HIGH ROLLERS

Holy Montreal Canadiens, Batman. Price, Pacioretty, Weber and Drouin. It has been a seasons worth of suffering in order to build towards this, so if nothing else, the High Rollers have earned it. Limping to the second worst regular season record in league history and buying low on every underperformer under the sun, the High Rollers are now staring down the barrell at twelve draft picks in the first 3 rounds of the draft - although the smart money is on the majority of those picks being moved well ahead of draft day. Some sleek farm eligibles raise the floor of this roster, but this tier placement really hinges on whether the aforementioned Habs can return to the production levels that they're more accustomed to, and not the absolute tire fires that they were last year.



## **DICK CHEESE**

Dick Cheese and Mr. Trade both made at least 40 trades in 2017-18, but while Mr. Trade slogged along through the year with a dismal record, Dick Cheese made their second consecutive playoff appearance and compiled the second best regular season record in franchise history. Now the two most prominant deal makers are sitting pretty in the top tier of teams heading into the 2018-19 season. It's been a slow climb to this point, but now Dick Cheese is going into next season with more



a shape as any heading into next season. THE 'OKAY. NOT GREAT, BUT BOUND TO CHANGE OBVIOUSLY BETTER THAN GOAT



A flirtation with competitiveness and a 7th place finish is a big deal for a team that finished with the worst record in the league for 5 straight years. Now, with an updated franchise name, a rock solid farm team, and top-of-theleague scoring and goaltending talent, the future is bright in Stittsville. The team is staring at a fairly standard draft NHL lockout. After getting burned by brutal goaltending position as they prepare to host this years' festivities - with performances time and time again, GOAT invested the lone exception being their possession of the first heavily in turning over his netminding crop, only to have overall pick. There isn't a generational talent available at the top of the draft a la Connor McDavid or Auston Matthews, but the draft and free agent crop is still very strong and the Stittsville Stache HC will have a terrific opportunity to add another building-block weapon to their surging roster. Taking advantage of draft selections is paramount for any team to be successful, but it is even more critical for the Stittsville Stache HC to do so in order



The back-to-back champion was dethroned in 2017-18, but still managed to put together a relatively successful season where they earned a first round bye and narrowly missed a third consecutive trip to the Fifty Mission Cup finals. That success was partially achieved by the returns on some promising young talent that was shipped out for more established veterans, and at the cost of a number of early round draft picks. While HC Haymos has shown a recent interest and ability in acquiring early round picks in the off-season, it is getting increasingly difficult to do so as their keeper and farm team talent pool has progressively thinned out. Still, through a handful of late season moves, they are heading into the off-season with Mission Cup winner recognizes that simple fact, as do they've created for themselves.

STITTSVILLE GOAT flipped a couple of high picks for Jeff Carter and STACHE HC Kevin Shattenkirk early in the 2017-18 season, and shortly after the swap both players were knocked out shortly after the swap, both players were knocked out for, what was effectively, the entire season with fluke injuries. After years of putting up with Evgeni Malkin's annual trip to the injured reserve for 20+ games, GOAT flipped him to another team and watched as he played a full season for the first time since before the most recent each and every one of his new acquisitions underperform, or just not perform at all. Welcome to the 'Alright, Enough of this bullshit, my luck is bound to change' tier. Like the Fisher Kings and their unlucky run up against uncharacteristically strong opponent statistics, the injury luck for GOAT has GOT to turn at some point. Contending in 2018-19 will not come easy to a team that only has 5 keepers going into the off-season, to show the entire league that 2017-18 wasn't a fluke, but but that shortfall is easily offset by an electric farm team rather the start of a stretch of seasons as a legitimate that includes 80+ point player Mikko Rantanen, the Fifty Mission Cup threat.

but that shortfall is easily offset by an electric farm team that includes 80+ point player Mikko Rantanen, the speedy Dylan Larkin, and 2017 1st overall NHFL draft pick Nico Hischier. GOAT was active on the trade market this year, and it left them in the middle of pack in the league in terms of draft pick packages. Only 1 pick in the first 3 rounds won't do much to help replenish their keeper-type talent group, but an abundance of picks in the 4th-to-12th rounds is enough to give GOAT every opportunity to break their 4-year playoff drought.

Flags fly forever. The NHFL's first three-time Fifty

Ancaster Villagers (previously Cerberus HC) were the ones that managed to come out on top and actually fly that flag. That privilege came at a shocking cost as the Villagers are going into the off-season with only six keepers (the first time in franchise history that they've had less than seven keepers. They have had eight keepers or more five times), and no farm spots (they've had 22 farm players in the 8 year history of the farm team entering this off-season). Making matters worse, they are entering the off-season with only 10 picks in the upcoming draft, with only one of those picks being placed in the first 6 rounds (the 44th overall selection). This, by no means, rules Cerberus HC out of contention for a fourth Fifty Mission Cup in 2018-19, as this is a team with a tradition of not missing the playoffs and of being able to turn nothing into something, with regularity. But it certainly puts them at a personnel and asset disadvantage compared to other teams. Some good luck, shrewd draft picks and a keen eye on the free agent list, and the Ancaster Villagers will be in the playoffs for the eleventh consecutive season.



Canada, eh? Almost made it.

Brigade HK came painstakingly close to capturing their first ever Fifty Mission Cup championship, and they went all-in in their persuit of doing so. While they managed to max out on their keeper spots (the only team to do so this year), and hang on to a farm spot to boot (which they used on keeper-calibre Jack Eichel) - their positioning for the upcoming draft is, by far, the most dire in franchise history: they are three draft picks short of being able to fill out their 2018-19 roster, and don't make their first pick in the 2018 draft until the 117th overall selection. Brigade HK's prime hope for returning to contention, again, in the coming season is a continued reliance on their starstudded keeper group: Jon Quick, Connor Hellebuyck and Cam Talbot in net, and scoring threats Jack Eichel, John Tavares, Steven Stamkos, Taylor Hall, Johnny Gaudreau, Artemi Panarin and Vladimir Tarasenko. Topto-bottom, Brigade HK possess arguably the premier keeper group in the NHFL, but it will be their efforts in filling the roster out around that group that will determine where they finish in the standings in 2018-19. Brigade HK was able to snap up some decent sleepers in the 2017 draft, so it isn't unrealistic to expect another run at their first Fifty Mission Cup championship in the coming season, just beware the reduced margin for error that

## FUNKY COLD MOLINA

For the second year in a row, Funky Cold Molina is entering the off-season with the standard seven-keeper, two farm spot roster set up. For the second year in a row, Funky Cold Molina is coming off a top-2 record in the regular season and first round playoff bye. For the second year in a row, Funky Cold Molina failed to fully capitalize on that playoff bye and fell short of the Fifty Mission Cup championship (that didn't need to be stated, but it still felt good to do so). For the second year in a row, Funky Cold Molina has a serious lack of picks in the first 10 rounds of the draft. For the second year in a row, Funky Cold Molina is being woefully underestimated heading into the coming season. After all, last year they were lumped in the 'Dark Horse' tier, and all they managed to do was nearly lead the league standings from start to finish. Funky Cold Molina seems to have discovered some kind of good juju, and ruling them out in a season preview is probably a poor idea - so consider placement in this tier as officially NOT ruling them out. Alex Ovechkin, Tyler Seguin, Phil Kessel, Andrei Vasilevskiy and Devan Dubnyk are still legit and are still the kind of keeper base that you need to be successful. Funky Cold Molina has proven to be resourceful and to have a keen eye for talent on the waiver wire, pair those skills with the rock solid keeper group and this is a franchise that always has a shot at being competitive.



## STATE COLLEGE MML

Maybe State College MML traded away all of their early round draft picks because they don't trust themselves to make good choices with them \*cough\* Jeff Skinner \*cough\* Craig Anderson \*cough\*. The MML don't draft until the 101st overall selection, and while a lack of early picks is becoming somewhat of a tradition for them, it hasn't been a death sentence, as they are currently riding a streak of seven straight seasons of making the playoffs. With seven keepers and no farm players, the Sea Dogs aren't heading into the off-season with a strength in numbers and will need to have their sleepers and breakout candidates in order when they start making their selections outside of the Top-100 players in the draft. Like the other teams in this tier, lacking early picks isn't anything new for State College MML, and also like the other teams in this tier, they have shown - on more than one occaision - that they are more than capable of overcoming the draft pick shortfall and don't have any issues icing a team that can be considered a legitimate candidate to compete for the Fifty Mission Cup.

### WILSONVILLAINS

After years of campaigning to gain membership to the premier fantasy hockey league in the world, this off-season guide is the official welcome to the NHFL for the Wilsonvillains. Apparently, a getting-to-know-you phase was not necessary for them, as they've already made themselves at home, and then some. Jumping naked, head-first down the lubed up slip 'n slide that is the trading culture of the NHFL, the Wilsonvillains quickly moved the transaction needle and made a series of legit trades to vastly improve their prospects for league contention. Taking advantage of the fertile grounds for wheeling and dealing during the two-week, expansion draft trade the Wilsonvillains leveraged their expansion status to land a suite of quality players in return for much less than they would typically fetch on the open market. The result is a team that is one solid NHFL draft away from being in the hunt for a playoff spot in their debut season in the league. It will still be an uphill battle for the new team, as their acquisitions did cost them some valuable picks in the front half of the draft, but this roster is positioned as well as some of the established NHFL franchises for competing for a spot in the Fifty Mission Cup playoffs.

## JOHNNY BEAMSVILLE

Johnny Beamsville returns to the NHFL six seasons after their initial departure, with a slightly thinner group of keepers obtained through the expansion process than they left their successor with, back in 2012. Slow playing the two-week, pre-expansion draft trade window worked well for Johnny Beamsville as they were able to secure a handful of useful pieces while minimizing the draft pick capital they had to surrender in return. NHFL fans are waiting, with bated breath, to see which Johnny Beamsville they'll be watching in the fall: the franchise that won the first two championships in NHFL history, or the one that fizzled out to a .360 winning percentage over their final two seasons. The fall draft will be critical to Johnny Beamsville's success in 2018-19 and beyond. With a reputation built, in part, on a keen eye for talent in the later rounds, Johnny Beamsville will be relying on their ability to search out diamonds in the rough to construct their keeper core going forward. It will be an uphill battle, but it's one that Johnny Beamsville has fought, and won, before.

## LOST IN THE SEMI-FINALS TO BRIGADE HK

After capturing their second consecutive Fifty Mission Cup, HC Haymos entered last offseason with the daunting task of trying to become the first three-time champion. The stars did not appear as though they would align in 2017-18 for HC Haymos, as injuries and poor performances -specifically from their goaltending tandem of Carey Price and Matt Murray - led to a demoralizing 38-53-7 record through the first one-third of the season. As the schedule flipped to the back half of the year, HC Haymos was still on the outside, looking in, to the Fifty Mission Cup playoff picture.

Michael Hayman remained patient. He continued to make small moves to improve the roster despite the slow start. When the gamut of injured players slowly starting returning to health, the increase in competitiveness for HC Haymos was notable: over an 8-week stretch, they rocketed up the standings, going from 8th place and well out of a playoff spot, all the way up to 2nd in the NHFL, and closing to within 12 points of Funky Cold Molina for the top record in the League. HC Haymos second half record - 80 wins, 46 losses and 14 ties - ended up as the best halfseason by any single team in 2017-18

Before the 2017 draft, Michael Hayman and Matthew Cheese - GM of Dick Cheese - teamed up for a twelve player swap involving Cam Talbot, Jeff Carter, Victor Hedman and three late round picks heading to Dick Cheese, while Matt Murray and five picks in the first six rounds were sent to HC Haymos. It was a massive swap that would go on to shape both teams' seasons - both for the better


and for the worst. Neither Matt Murray nor Cam Talbot came close to duplicating their 2016-17 success. Jeff Carter was shipped out of town before playing a game for Dick Cheese, and Victor Hedman wound up back on HC Haymos a couple months later after a three-way trade between HC Haymos, Dick Cheese and Mr. Trade.

In addition to Hedman, Hayman would also bring John Carlson, Roberto Luongo, Mark Giordano, Mikael Granlund, David Perron, Logan Couture and Brayden Schenn into the fray for their run at a third straight title. A second place finish in the regular season, behind Funky Cold Molina inverting their 1-2 finish from the previous year - meant a semi-final matchup with a Brigade HK team that was playing their best hockey of the year. A close matchup didn't break HC Haymos' way, and their run towards a third straight title had ended.

As HC Haymos brushes themselves off after that disappointing ouster from the playoffs, they turn their sights to the 2018-19 season - where they once again have an impressive grouping of keeper players with which to work. New to the HC Haymos keeper crop this year is NHFL Rookie-of-the-Year Brock Boeser, and stellar two-way centers Patrice Bergeron and Vincent Trocheck - all players that were drafted in 2017 by HC Haymos. Preseason acquisition Matt Murray, and lateseason acquisition Brayden Schenn round out the keeper group with '16-'17 returnees Brad Marchand, Ryan Getzlaf, Jakub Voracek and Victor Hedman.

GM Hayman has proven to be capable of building a title-contending roster on an annual basis, and will be out to do the same in 2018-19.






SEASONOPREVIEW

All good things must come to an end. And while HC Haymos did manage to make it to the semi-finals for the fourth straight post-season, the obvious flaws of their roster caused them to fall short of their ultimate goal. GM Hayman is positioned better than he has been in more recent off-seasons, with an acceptable stable of early round draft picks to accompany their grouping of above-average keepers. However, aside from Brock Boeser, Vincent Trocheck and Matt Murray, GM Hayman will be building their roster around a collection of players at the end - or in some cases, just past - their prime years, so it's getting close to make or break time for the core of this team if they hope to squeeze out another Fifty Mission Cup title before a major roster shakeup needs to happen. GM Hayman is looking to Matt Murray to rebound from a disappointing season, in order to return to the championship circle in 2018-19.



thev finished disappointing 9th place last season, Brigade HK was sludging along with a sub-.500 record, and was bouncing in and out of a playoff spot through the first nine weeks of 2017-18 before something clicked. Brigade HK would go on to win eight, and tie one, of the next eleven weeks, compiling a record of 90-56-8 over that stretch, vaulting them to a 3rd place finish in the regular season standings. That run set them up for a matchup with Dick Cheese in the first round of the Fifty

What a ride for Brigade HK and Mission Cup playoffs. A resounding 10-3 GM Kristopher Heil in 2017-18. victory against Dick Cheese advanced a Brigade HK to their first semi-final appearance since 2014, and pit them against two-time defending champion HC Haymos, who were on a stellar secondhalf run of their own. A back-and-forth matchup turned up favorable for Brigade HK, as they secured an 8-6 victory and a ticket to the Fifty Mission Cup finals.

Making their first appearance in the finals matchup in eight years, Brigade HK managed to keep it close until the very end, when a white-hot Cerberus HC squad pulled away late and denied Brigade HK


their first ever championship. It was a generally quiet year in the transaction department for GM Heil, when compared to the rest of the NHFL - as he finished with the fewest free agent transactions (35 total, 7 less than the next fewest), and the fewest trades (11 total, 3 fewer than the second-fewest total). While the trade total may have been the fewest in the league, it also happened to be a career high for Brigade HK.

The most impactful transaction of the year for Brigade HK could arguably have been the selection of Taylor Hall with the second overall pick in the 2017 draft. Taylor had an MVP-worthy season after dropping completely out of favour after a lackluster 2016-17 that saw him score at 60-point full season pace. Bouncing back in a big way, Hall finished with 39 goals and 54 assists in 76 games in 2017-18 - a 100-point full season pace!

Hall's resurgence is just one part of the equation that explains Brigade HK's meteoric rise from 9th place to Flfty Mission Cup finalist. In 2016-17, Steven Stamkos was limited to 17 games after experiencing a devasted knee injury. This year, he was able to play 78 games and didn't lose a step, scoring 86 points for his highest total in a season since he scored 60 goals in 2011-12. Jonathan Quick was another Brigade HK superstar that was limited to only 17 games played in 2016-17. He got right back into the swing of things with a 2.40 GAA, a .921 SV% and 33 wins.

In addition, John Tavares and Johnny Gaudreau returned to scoring prominence after noticeable dips in production in 2016-17. Combine it all and the pieces were always there for Brigade HK to have a season similar to their 2017-18, it was simply a matter of staying healthy and playing at a level similar to established career norms.

Currently, Brigade HK has zero picks in the first 9 rounds of the draft - so finding the next Taylor Hall will be more difficult in 2018. However, with the core compiled by GM Heil, including the aforementioned Hall, Stamkos, Quick, Tavares and Gaudreau, as well as star forwards Artemi Panarin, Vladimir Tarasenko, and Jack Eichel, newly-minted goaltending stalwart Connor Hellebuyck, and the workhorse Cam Talbot, one could argue that Brigade HK will be just fine without the early picks.



It will be interesting to see how GM Heil navigates the draft waters without many (any) early round picks with which to supplement his elite group of keepers and farm players. Scoring should not be a concern for the 2018-19 version of Brigade HK, as they ostensibly have their starting forward positions already filled with point-per-game players. Likewise, a goaltending trio of Connor Hellebuyck, Jonathan Quick and Cam Talbot has the potential and the talent wherewithal to be the top grouping in the entire NHFL. If Heil can turn the picks that he does have into pieces that compliment the outstanding group of offensive producers that he currently possesses, then a playoff spot should be easily attainable at the very least, with Fifty Mission Cup contender and finalist an equally reasonable goal for the season. This group of players is on the rise, and will ensure Brigade HK's competitiveness for years to come.

the past two seasons is one of being painstakingly close to the NHFL pinnacle, but ultimately coming up just short. After missing the playoffs in 2015-16, Funky Cold Molina finished 2016-17 with the 4th best regular season winning percentage in league history jockying back and forth with HC Haymos for the top record in the Leaders Division and the League. In 2017-18, they owned the top record in the NHFL for 17 of the 20 regular season weeks. In both years, they earned first round-byes in the Fifty Mission Cup playoffs. In both years, they lost to the eventual Fifty Mission Cup winner.

How did Funky Cold Molina get here? picks - none in the first six rounds to be exact. Then, on the eve of the 10th anniversary NHFL Draft, Funky Cold Molina got to work. First flipping Pekka Rinne and a 5th round pick in return for Cam Atkinson, and one pick in each of the first 3 rounds of the draft (including the 4th overall selection). They then moved that 4th overall pick, along with a 7th rounder and their 2018 1st round pick, in return for superstars Tyler Seguin and Dustin Byfuglien. For those keeping track at home, the net player movement in those two deals shakes out as follows:

<u>OUT.</u> Pekka Rinne, 5th round pick (Max Domi), 1st round pick (Jeff Skinner), 7th round pick (Steve Mason) and a 2018 1st round pick

IN Cam Atkinson, Tyler Seguin, Dustin Byfuglien, 2nd round pick (Evander Kane), 3rd round pick (Roman Josi)

Let's repeat that.

Pekka Rinne, Max Domi, Jeff Skinner, Steve Mason and a 1st round pick for Cam

The Funky Cold Molina story of Cam Atkinson, Tyler Seguin, Dustin Byfuglien, Evander Kane and Roman Josi. Queue up Andrei Vasilevskiy from the farm to take Pekka Rinne's roster spot, and Funky Cold Molina was off and flying. Two deals, just before the draft, completely reshaped the 2017-18 outlook for Funky Cold Molina

> GM Michael Mesquita was able to make a number of not-earth-shattering, yet still influential trades throughout the season, as well as some shrewd freeagent pickups. All these transactions and the sustained success on the season led Mesquita to be selected as the GM of the Year by his peers.

Looking toward the upcoming season, They started with a barren stable of draft the early-round draft pick cupboard is once again empty for Funky Cold Molina: zero picks in the first 9 rounds. Baring a series of moves similar to those pulled off prior to the 2017 draft, Funky Cold Molina will be leaning on continued strong performances from his keeper and farm squads. Alex Ovechkin, Phil Kessel, and Devan Dubnyk return from Molina's 2017 keeper crop and will be relied upon, once again, to be the leaders in 2018-19. Andrei Vasilevskiy's coming-out party has elevated him to elite-keeper status, as he has officially graduated from the farm team and went on to have an historically superb season. Tyler Seguin, Evander Kane and Roman Josi are the new-comer keepers that are expected to continue the heavy lifting that they carried out this past season. William Nylander is the standout on Molina's farm team, with Pittsburgh backup goaltender Tristan Jarry joining him there over the off-season.



A lack of impactful draft picks and a standard number of keepers and farm players would normally mean gloomy times lie ahead, but not for Funky Cold Molina and GM Michael Mesquita. Mesquita has shown an eye for talent and an ability to acquire it at less than full price, resulting in only the second team to net back-to-back first round playoff byes in league history, It would be unwise to underestimate Mesquita and Funky Cold Molina in 2018-19, as they are more motivated than ever to get over the championship hump that they've come so close to achieving in the last two years. No one wants the title of being the best NHFL team to never win a Fifty Mission Cup, and though Mesquita has a number of stars with youth on their side (Nylander, Vasilevsky, Kane) their core of Ovechkin and Kessel are on the wrong side of their prime, and the clock is ticking.




little off the active roster, while also significant boosting the strength of the team. But like GOAT seems to experience much too often, luck had other plans.

Malkin was on a 5-year streak where he missed an average of 20 games per year. Patrick Kane finished 1st and 2nd in league scoring in the two preceeding seasons. So of course Kane would score at below a point-per-game for the first time since 2012 (and go -20 to boot), and Malkin would have a healthy season and finish with 98 points.

The track record of production that Jeff Carter and Kevin Shattenkirk have cemented over the history of the NHFL is worthy of their past keeper and high draft pick status. So naturally, the two of them would combine to play less than a single full season, with Jeff Carter suffering an ankle injury in mid-October, and Kevin Shattenkirk getting shut down in mid-January with a knee injury. Couple all that unfortunate news with severe underperformances from newly acquired goaltenders Martin Jones AND Cory Schneider (when HE wasn't battling injury), and it isn't difficult to discern how and where the season went off the rails for GOAT in 2017-18.

Looking toward 2018-19, GOAT has a bevy of extra picks, the result of flipping a couple keeper spots and a farm spot in return for a number of Cerberus HC's draft picks - without sending any back in return. In total GOAT has 28 picks in the first 12 rounds. He only needs 18 to fill out his roster and farm team.

GOATs crop of players that he has going into next season is passable. Martin Jones and Cory Schneider are good goalies, and they have the potential to be a solid tandem in net in 2017-18. Mikko Rantanen, Nico Hischier and Dylan Larkin are three excellent young pieces to harbour and watch grow into NHFL superstars. The veteran core of Jeff Carter, Patrick Kane and Sean Monahan is thin when compared to other NHFL rosters - but GOAT posseses enough on their farm and in the draft pick cupboard to fill out a deep and talented roster around them. A return to health for Carter and Monahan - who underwent 4 surgeries at the end of the season - a return to prominence for Patrick Kane, and the continued evolution of the players on the farm team, and this could be the makings of a competitive roster.


GM Quinlan was active on the trade front, making multiple attempts to reshape the dynamic and makeup of his roster. In the biggest one-for-one trade on the season, perhaps in league history, GOAT sent Evgeni Malkin packing in return for Patrick Kane. Just over a month earlier, GOAT landed Kevin Shattenkirk and Jeff Carter in return for only draft pick capital.

On the surface, those acquisitions all seem to point in the direction of roster improvement shrewd moves, giving up

## BOTTOMLINE

Currently owning the second-longest playoff drought in the NHFL, GM Quinlan has been working overtime to align GOAT's assests with themselves, and the progress is visible: a trio of farm players with major growth potential, that have already shown a penchant for contributing at the NHFL level, a pair of legit starting goaltenders on teams that made the NHL playoffs in 2018 and a real threat to win the Art Ross trophy. 2017-18 was the worst season for GOAT, from a winning percentage perspective, in franchise history - whatever tactic or approach that was taken to formulate last years' roster should never see the light of day again. With the number of draft picks that GOAT currently has in stock, the pressure will be on GM Quinlan, both to pare down the sheer number of players/picks, and to make the most of the picks he keeps in order to snap that lengthy playoff drought.

tightrope walk along the playoff bubble: never comfortably in it, never comfortably out of it, but always uncomfortably within striking distance. Over weeks 4 to 19 of the season, the Fisher Kings' found themselves short of the 6th overall seed by an average of 7 points per week. That includes sitting in a playoff spot over the 7th seed by as many as 4 points, and trailing the final playoff spot by as many as 19 points.

It is difficult to reconcile the 2017-18 offensive and goaltending performances of the Fisher Kings with their franchiseworst record of 7 matchup wins versus 13 matchup defeats this year, until you consider the performances of the Fisher

Kings' weekly opponents.

From a statistical standpoint, the Fisher Kings deserved better. They finished 5th or better in 10 of the 14 scoring categories on the season: only the regular season champion Funky Cold Molina, and the eventual Fifty Mission Cup champion Cerberus HC equalled or bettered that production level. No one in the league faced a tougher opponents schedule - again in 10 of the 14 scoring categories, the Fisher Kings went up against a top-3 season-long category total, a feat made even more rare when you consider that the top-3 production from the Fisher Kings themselves is, naturally, not included in their opponent totals.

Despite the unfortunate statistical anomalies, Fisher Kings remained competitive until the penultimate matchup of the regular season. Once the hope for capturing the final playoff spot shifted from 'fighting chance' to 'pipe dream', Fisher


The Fisher Kings' season was a Kings GM James Tchegus moved into off mode and quickly built an impressive stockpile of futures.

On the days leading up to and including trade déadline day, GM Tchegus was able to ship out Sasha Barkov, Sergei Bobrovsky, Jason Zucker, Brayden Schenn, Mark Giordano, Mikael Granlund, Wayne Simmonds, Oliver Ekman-Larsson, Milan Lucic and Jamie Benn in return for a cornucopia of early round draft picks: 19 picks in the first 8 rounds, including 3 of the top 4 in the whole draft, and five first round picks in total.

Those picks should give GM Tchegus ample opportunity to add a championshipworthy supporting cast around their current group of keeper and farm players. Two-time scoring champion Connor McDavid highlights a farm team that is absolutely loaded: sophomore Brayden Point followed up his impressive rookie campaign with a 32-goal, 66-point performance, and Juuse Saros pristine numbers in net can't be overlooked as he eyes the starting job in Nashville. Fisher Kings' core-3 skater keepers are still arguably the best in all the league: Sidney Crosby is still producing at elite levels, and despite relative 'down' years for defenders Brent Burns and Erik Karlsson, their multicategory value still ranks them among the league leaders in the NHFL

Jaden Schwartz has shown himself to be a dangerous offensive weapon when healthy. GM Tchegus can likely focus all their draft picks on skaters, as their keeper goaltending group of Braden Holtby, Jake Allen and Saros sets them up well to be competitive in the goalie categories from the moment the puck drops.







Two straight years out of the playoffs for a team boasting talent such as Connor McDavid, Sidney Crosby, Brent Burns and Erik Karlsson is unacceptable, and GM James Tchegus will be the first one to tell you that. GM Tchegus has amassed an envious number of draft picks that will be able to be used to select any number of potentially impact players to surround the keeper and farm players already in tow. Bounceback seasons from both Jake Allen and Braden Holtby will be necessary to further elevate the Fisher Kings up the standings. With Crosby and Burns on the back-half of their prime, their stellar levels of production will not be able to be relied upon much longer, but having McDavid, Point and Saros yet to enter their prime years. Fisher Kings is positioned extremely well to maintain their status of having the premier group of keepers in the league.

## OST IN THE QUARTER-FINALS TO BRIGADE HK

2017-18 marks four consecutive years of improved winning percentages for Dick Cheese (.403, .429, .502 & .523), and while they have yet to make it out of the first round of the playoffs, GM Matt Cheese has constructed a solid group of young keepercalibre talent to go along with the budding success of the franchise.

Dick Cheese had a fairly even-keeled season with respect to their league standing and overall team performance: never finding themselves outside of the playoffs, but also (aside from a few short-lived flirtations with 2nd and 3rd) never finding themselves higher than 4th place. They notched 69 (nice) of their wins in the first half of the year, and then followed that up with 65 more in the second half. They won 5 matchups in the first half. They won 5 matchups in the second half.

Despite this consistency, and seemingly solid fantasy hockey floor, confidence was low for Dick Cheese GM Matt Cheese heading into the Fifty Mission Cup playoffs. Team leader Auston Matthews was on the IR, Henrik Lundqvist was in a funk, and his team was in line to face one or both of the two hottest teams over the second half of the season (Brigade HK and HC Haymos). It turned out that the pessimism was well-founded as a 10-3 victory by Brigade HK over Dick Cheese in the quarter-finals promptly ended Dick Cheese's season in a similar fashion to their 2016-17 finish.

All told, Dick Cheese's .523 winning percentage in 2017-18 represents their high water mark with Matt Cheese in charge of making decisions, and trails only the .528 winning percentage from

2010-2011 for the best season in franchise history.

When evaluating the positives of the future of Dick Cheese, one need look no further than Auston Matthews. The second overall pick in 2017 has presided over both of Dick Cheese's playoff appearances, scoring at 40, and 45-goal paces respectively. Skating on Matthews wing will be 21-year-old David Pastrnak, who was one of 21 players to score 80 points this year. Those two are complimented up front by a couple more talented, early-20 offensive threats in Viktor Arvidsson and Nikolaj Ehlers. Both players potted 60+points in 2017-18, and will look to build on their successful seasons in 2018-19.

Anchoring that young group will be a trio of established veterans in Mike Hoffman, Mark Stone and Wayne Simmonds. That trio had their ups and downs in 2017-18, but a full season of health out of each of them will go a long way to seeing Dick Cheese improve their league standing for a 5th consecutive year.

GM Cheese acquired two future Lidstrom Trophy candidates this season in Charlie McAvoy and Mikhail Sergachev. While both players are currently behind an incumbent No. 1 on their respective defensemen depth charts, it isn't expected to be long before one or both are pushing for a share of prime ice time deployment at the expense of their more established teammates.

Dick Cheese enters the off-season with a pair of stable netminders that should give them peace of mind to focus on making additions to their skater group. It's a young team, with room to grow, and something to prove.


GM Matt Cheese made 40 trades in 2017-18, built a playoff hockey club, accumulated more combined keepers & farm spots than any other GM, and managed to collect enough draft picks to be done his 2018 draft before the end of the 9th round. All this while also filling those keeper and farm spots with legit, top-of-the-league talent and prospects. Fully healthy seasons from Matthews, Stone and Simmonds will be vital to Dick Cheese's 2018-19 success. If Ben Bishop can catch lightning in a bottle and return a season similar to what he has proven capable of putting up in his prime, this will be a truly dangerous team to face off against. The draft pick situation that GM Cheese managed to work himself into is not one to be overlooked: currently owning 9 of the first 58 picks in the draft, watch for GM Cheese to give in to his urge to make trades and flip any number of those picks for veteran skaters.

#### FIFTY MISSION CUP CHAMPIONS

Formerly Known as Cerberus HC has a lot of real estate tied up in flag flying for the forseeable future.

Now the 'Ancaster Villagers', GM Evan Ouzounis headed up a brand overhaul in the off-season after Cerberus HC captured their third Fifty Mission Cup championship, and first since the 2012-13 lockout shortened season. Their run to the title was the stuff of legends: over the final 5 weeks of the regular season, and the 3 weeks of the playoffs, Cerberus HC scored 200 goals - or an average of 25 per week! Over the same timeframe, they also averaged 35 assists per week. This offensive outburst helped Cerberus steamroll to this years' title, as they dispatched State College MML (11-2), Funky Cold Molina (11-3) and Brigade HK (10-4) with various levels of relative ease.

The success achieved by Cerberus HC this season maintains a tradition that goes back to the inception of the NHFL: 10 consecutive seasons in the Fifty Mission Cup playoffs and 5 consecutive seasons making an appearance in, at least, the championship semi-final. 2017-18 also marked the 8th time that Cerberus HC played to a regular season win-loss record with a winning percentage of .550% or greater, a feat no other team has accomplished more than 5 times.

GM Ouzounis made a number of brazen trades over the course of the season - including an outrageous swap where he gave up the majority of Cerberus HC's draft picks in exchange for a couple keeper and farm spots, without receiving any picks in return. Ouzounis would go on bring key contributors in

Flags fly forever, and the Artist championship run, including Eric Staal, Leon Draisaitl, Joe Pavelski, John Gibson, Gabriel Landeskog, Oliver Ekman-Larsson, Patrick Maroon, and Jamie Benn.


Those acquisitions did come at a cost, and despite an exciting quartet of forwards in Benn, Draisaitl, Laine and MacKinnon, the Ancaster Villagers are entering the offseason with only six keepers total, and no farm spots. It's a shocking departure from the typical M.O. of GM Ouzounis, as years past had seen him acquire additional keeper and farm spots, and stockpile early round draft picks.

Speaking of draft picks, GM Ouzounis was able to work some magic and reacquire a number of picks in the upcoming draft. Currently, Cerberus HC owns 10 draft picks total - 7 of which are in the first 10 rounds. That means - with the six keeper and farm spots that they own, and the 10 draft picks - the Villagers will exit the draft with 16 players, while it takes 23 players to fill a complete roster and an additional 3 players to populate the farm

The good news is that the Villagers appear to be set in goal, where midseason acquisitions John Gibson and Tuukka Rask helped carry Cerberus HC to the 2018 Fifty Mission Cup and will look to provide stability to what otherwise could be a rocky start to the season as GM Ouzounis is forced to comb the free agent list to fill his roster out.

The player shortfall is a small price to pay however, as GM Ouzounis can now celebrate as the first 3-time champion in NHFL history. Also, history has taught us to expect GM Ouzounis to improve their current situation, no matter what that is







A successful championship run has left the Villagers virtually depleted heading into 2018-19. With 6 keepers and 10 draft picks GM Ouzounis is going to have to get creative and aggressive in rebuilding his roster if he hopes to take another run at the 2019 Fifty Mission Cup. Benn, MacKinnon, Draisaitl and Laine is as electric a collection of young forwards that there may be in the whole NHFL, but their skill alone will not be enough to carry an offence through the NHFL schedule. GM Quzounis can shift their focus away from upgrading in goal, as Rask and Gibson are both excellent netminders on strong NHL teams, and both showed what they're capable of in Cerberus HC's title run. Watch for GM Ouzounis to be active leading up to the draft, because fielding a title-contending hockey team is in his blood - he's made it look easy over the past 10 years, this time he'll have to work a little harder for it.



Despite this, State College entered the playoffs scuffling, winning only 2 of their final 6 regular season weeks heading into their first round matchup, but optimism was high as a flurry of moves in the last week of February transformed the MML, moving out a number of struggling veterans and

bringing in some dynamic talent playing at


or near the top of their game.

State College MML's main focus in the days leading up to the trade deadline was finding an upgrade in net. For five months, State College leaned on Braden Holtby (2.85 GAA, .911 SV%), Henrik Lundqvist (2.82 GAA, .914 SV%) and Craig Anderson (3.41 GAA, .891 SV%) to provide their goaltending services. One week before the start of the playoffs - all within 48 hours -State College MML GM Michael Sheriff had released Craig Anderson, flipped a struggling Braden Holtby for 2017 Vezina Trophy winner Sergei Bobrovsky, used team scoring leader Nikita Kucherov to pry eventual 2018 Vezina Trophy winner Pekka Rinne away from The White Stache HC, nd sent future Hall-of-Famer Henrik undqvist to Dick Cheese in return for a pair of LA Kings in the midst of renaissance seasons (Dustin Brown and Jake Muzzin).

The goaltending turnover worked like a charm - State College netminders had posted a collective 2.92 GAA and .909 SV% over the first 19 weeks of the season. The final 3 weeks of the year with the new crop returned league-leading-worthy totals of a 2.31 GAA and a .927 SV%. Alas, just as soon as the goaltending showed up for MML, the offence completely dried up. In

their quarter-final matchup, skaters registered their most dismal statistical performance of the entire year, producing goal, assist, powerplay point, shots on goal, hits and blocks totals worthy of a JOCKO contender, let alone an NHFL playoff team.

Looking ahead towards 2018-19, GM Sheriff finds himself in a recently familiar position: lacking many (er, any?) early round draft picks, or farm spots, In fact, going all the way back to the 2015 NHFL draft, State College MML has only had two farm players and three total picks in the first 2 rounds of the draft since then, fluctuating between 6 and 8 total keepers (7 this year). State College MML and GM Sheriff have perscribed to an 'all-in' mentality in pursuit of the Fifty Mission Cup, which has led to a chronic lack in asset quantity going into the offseason. GM Sheriff has proven time and again that they are more than capable of overcoming this shortfall, last missing the playoffs in 2011 and winning a pair of championships since then. The teams' success in 2018-19 will once again hinge on GM Sheriff's ability to make something out of, what is seemingly, nothing.



State College MML GM Michael Sheriff is going to have to follow a similar blueprint to recent seasons in order to roster a competitive team in 2018-19. With no picks in the first 8 rounds of the draft, no farm spots, and the standard number of keepers. GM Sheriff isn't facing anything that he isn't used to. He is confident that he'll be able to out-perform some, or all, of his GM peers in the draft, in the trade arena, and on the free agent list. He has a sound foundation on which to build: late-season acquisitions Bobrovsky and Rinne form a formidable tandem in goal. Blake Wheeler is a Bar Down Trophy candidate and headlines the skater group. Couturier, Kuznetsov, Aho and the electric Filip Forsberg are all on the right side of the aging curve, and all will be relied on to maintain this rosters' competitiveness. It will be an uphill battle to a 2019 playoff spot, but none are better suited than GM Sheriff to make it happen.



## DID NOT QUALIFY FOR PLAYOFFS

planted for Stittsville (nee White) Stache HC at the end of the 2016-17 season. Heading into the 10th anniversary draft, GM Chris White possessed a promising keeper group, and a healthy stable of early round draft picks. Not resting on his laurels, and looking to bust out of a streak of five straight last place finishes in the regular season, GM White made the decision to overhaul his keeper group ahead of the 10th draft in league history. The overhaul was highlighted by bringing in goaltenders Marc-Andre Fleury, Pekka Rinne and Corey Crawford. All that those goaltenders managed to do for Stittsville Stache HC was put up GAAs of 2.21, 2.33 and 2.38, and save percentages of .928, .926 and .927. The end result was a leagueleading team-wide goals against average and save percentage (the first time that White Stache HC was tops in the league in any category). This stellar goaltending performance helped to elevate the White Stache HC in the standings to levels that had previously been quite unfamiliar to the franchise: sole possession or a share of first overall in the league for a total of four weeks. Top three for seven weeks. Top five for 10 weeks. In a playoff spot for twelve weeks. All career bests for Chris White as an NHFL GM. And then the wheels came off, as a 69-59-12 record in the first half was undone by a 57-74-9 mark over the final 10 weeks, prized offseason acquisitions Crawford and Fleury hit the injured reserve, players that had gotten off to fast starts - Vladislav Namestnikov, Mikhail Sergachev, Dustin

The seeds of optimism were considerably. The tailspin included winning planted for Stittsville (nee White) only 3 of the final 12 weeks of the year, Stache HC at the end of the and a drop from 3rd place to as low as 8th.

While he had sold off a number of high picks in the 2019 draft to reshape his roster and ultimately generate a playoff contender for half a season, once things started going south for the team, GM White acted swiftly in recouperating draft pick capital, snagging 8 picks in the first 5 rounds of the upcoming draft.

GM Chris White has maneuvered his roster into a position for success in the near future, as Stittsville Stache HC possesses some of most lethal offensive weapons in the NHFL in forwards Nikita Kucherov, Evgeni Malkin and Mark Scheifele, Veterans Corey Crawford and Marc-Andre Fleury form a strong tandem in net, but both will need to shake the injury bug that bit them hard this past year. That group is complimented by an offensively gifted farm team comprised of rising stars Jon Marchessault (75 points for the expansion Vegas Golden Knights), Clayton Keller (65 points as a 19-year-old rookie in Arizona) and Matthew Tkachuk (60-point pace as a sophomore while contributing PIMs and hits). That's a lot of firepower that Stittsville Stache HC can run out on the ice on a weekly basis, and there's more coming as they have their pick of the non-keeper litter with the first overall selection in the coming NHFL draft.

Despite missing the playoffs for the seventh consecutive season, there is a true sense of optimism surrounding this franchise at the moment. A return to health in net, and continued development of their farm players is all that's needed to take that next step into true contention.


While GM Chris White can revel in the steps forward that his White Stache HC took this season - including team bests in total points, league standing, and a number of offensive and goaltending category totals - there is still much work yet to be done. Adding Malkin and Kucherov in a couple of shrewd trades transformed this roster from always thinking about next season, to thinking about making a run at the Fifty Mission Cup immediately. With a favorable draft position (including the first overall pick) and a respectable supporting cast of keepers and farm players, this is arguably the best position GM White has ever put himself in at this point of the year. If GM White is able to find similar success in free agency this year as he did in 2017-18, and if he takes advantage of the high draft picks, this could be the year that Stittsville Stache HC finally finds themselves with a legitimate shot at the Fifty Mission Cup



# DID NOT QUALIFY FOR PLAYOFFS

Well, that was eventful. In a round, and six more in the 3rd round. season that saw record levels of involvement on the transaction of course it was Mr. Trade (henceforth to be known as the 'Toronto High Rollers') leading the charge with 43 individual moves. GM Jason White managed to turn over his entire crop of keepers in a little over two weeks before the season even started, and that was just the beginning. At their peak, Mr. Trade was in possession of 9 of the 10 available 1st round draft picks. Ultimately, they traded back down to only one 1st round pick, but they still own five picks in the 2nd

This accumulation (and then purge) of draft picks came at the expense of the 2017-18 season for Mr. Trade and their fans, as only the 2014-15 season endured by the White Stache had a lower winning percentage (.284) that the meager .325 mark that the squad led by GM Jason White managed to muster this past season.

After an impressive victory over HC Haymos in the opening week of the season, Mr. Trade won 2 categories total over the next two weeks to sink their 2018 NHFL playoff bid. GM White was in sell-off mode from even before that moment,


as he consistently scoured the free agent list and waiver wire for any sign of value, pounced on that value, then dilligently worked to find a fit on other NHFL rosters for that value. The roster turnover was impressive, and it led to 110 different goalies and skaters suiting up for Mr. Trade in 2017-18, naturally leading the league.

It would take quite some time to run through all the major deals that Mr. Trade was a part of this year, so instead here is a summary of some of those 110 goalies and skaters that donned the double blue and white this past season: Jonathan Drouin. Corey Perry, Henrik Lundqvist, Jeff Carter, Kevin Shattenkirk, Roberto Luongo, Anders Lee, Sean Couturier, James Neal, Semyon Varlamov, Leon Draisaitl, Bo Horvat, William Karlsson, Logan Couture, Mathew Barzal, Joe Thornton, Tuukka Rask, Duncan Keith, John Carlson, Brayden Schenn, Max Pacioretty, Carey Price, James van Riemsdyk and Shea Weber.

Turning the attention to the 2018-19 season, after the revolving door of transactions, GM Jason White finds himself in a much better position than in which he started the season. The Toronto High Rollers are blessed with a farm team

overflowing with talent, including NHL rookie-of-the-year Mathew Barzal, NHL 2017 1st overall draft selection Nolan Patrick, and two-time 60+ point scorer Mitch Marner.

A flurry of deals leading up to the trade deadline brought in the keeper studs that the High Rollers are hoping can bounce back in 2018-19. Carey Price had a down season, unable to stay healthy or find any consistency on the ice. Max Pacioretty failed to score at least 30 goals for the first time while playing a full season. Shea Weber showed the same multi-category abilities that made him an NHFL star before being lost for the season with an ankle injury after only 26 games played. Jonathan Drouin showed the promise of being the 3rd overall pick in his final season with Tampa, but fell flat after being sent out of town for young defenseman Mikhail Sergachev. If you've been keeping track at home, you may have noticed a theme: the Toronto High Rollers have placed quite a bit of stock in players from the Montreal Canadiens putting their abysmal 2017-18 behind them. It appears the Canadiens and the High Rollers have a lot in common.





GM Jason White went bananas on the trade market in 2017-18. And while the success of his keeper crop hinges on whether the group of Canadiens he has can return to their career average levels of production, the overall success of the High Rollers will boil down to GM Jason White's ability to cash in on the 11 picks that he's accumulated in the combined 2nd and 3rd rounds of the draft. The farm team is loaded with future superstars, but it may be a few years yet before they're able to carry an NHFL team on their own. In the meantime, the draft picks have the ability to serve as the perfect bridge to superstardom for Barzal, Marner and Patrick, and can help return the High Rollers back to the playoffs as soon as the 2018-19 season. When it comes to GM White, it's impossible to forecast how it will all shake out - as there is as good a chance that he trades every draft pick away as there is that he doesn't.

Final attendance numbers for all NHFL teams from the 2017-18 regular season have been submitted and compiled. This was the first season that attendance data for all 10 NHFL teams was available, as Brigade HK and State College MML had kept that information private and confidential in 2016-17.

# THE BIG PICTURI

The overall attendance picture was an encouraging one, as league-wide attendance was up by 0.35% (from 100.52% up to 100.87%). Half of the league teams averaged at least a sellout, and half of the teams' average attendances improved over 2016-17 totals.

# THE GOOD

HC Haymos led the NHFL in average (23,145) and total attendance (948,949), along with percentage to capacity (110.0 percent). This excellent performance at the gates continued a trend that HC Haymos started in 2016-17. HC Haymos has maintained an at-capacity attendance level since the league started tracking the stat in 2016.

The franchise with the biggest jump from 2016-17 to 2017-18 in average attendance was the White Stache HC, with an increase of 8.34% over their 83.82% mark last season. Dick Cheese also saw a considerable bump in attendance numbers, increasing their crowd size by an average of 4.55%. It only took three weeks of matchups before Funky Cold Molina reached the 110.00% capacity mark, which is where they stayed for the rest of 2017-18.

# THE BAD

On the flip side, GOAT represented the bottom of the league in both average and total attendance. The fanbase is there, as GOAT still managed to draw 16,590 fans per game on average (89.68% to capacity), and there is room for optimism as their 2017-18 average was actually a 0.76% improvement on 2016-17.


# THE OULY

The largest decrease in average attendance went to Mr. Trade, who experienced a massive 10.10% dip. The exodus of star power and the tailspin down the standings coincided with the precipitous drop in gate receipts. Mr. Trade is hoping for a wild swing back in the positive direction in 2018-19. The next largest drop in average attendance belonged to the Fisher Kings, who missed the playoffs for the second consecutive year and saw their 106.31% average (buoyed by a trip to the Fifty Mission Cup finals the previous year), drop 6.48% down to just a shade below averaging a sell-out for the season (99.83%)

# THE SKINNY

The increase in overall league attendance from 2016-17 to 2017-18 is a positive sign that the NHFL continues to gain popularity. Teams that struggled at the gates in 2017-18 - namely Mr. Trade and Fisher Kings - have positioned themselves for a rebound year in 2018-19. Add to that the anticipated attendance boost from the start of the two expansion franchises in October, and expectations are high for even stronger attendance figures in the coming season.

The weekly attendance breakdown can paint a detailed picture of how seasons progressed for each franchise.



HC Haymos started the year at the maximum attendance threshold, and managed to hang on to that title all season. The back-to-back Fifty Mission Cup titles built up enough goodwill with their fanbase to span the rough stretch at the start of the season.



Funky Cold Molina needed only 3 weeks before locking down the prestigious 110% attendance level. They strengthened their attendance positioning over the rest of the season and will gun for a full slate of max sellouts.



Cerberus HC's upward trend in attendance culminated with their 3rd Fifty Misson Cup - which will give them an instant boost to start the coming season. There's still work to be done to hit the elusive 110% mark.



State College MML's success was reflected in their steady rise in attendance. The excitement from their last title will have worn off by the time the new season starts.



Dick Cheese is looking for a full season of attendance growth, then they'll reach the same levels as the teams in the top teirs in terms of crowd size.



Brigade HK rode a strong second half all the way to the Fifty Mission Cup finals, and their fans came out in droves to support them, especially down the stretch.



After hanging around in the playoff hunt for most of the season, a late year firesale, and a decided drop out of the playoff race, caused attendance figures to plunge.



Mr. Trade's 2016-17 success gave their fanbase a shot in the arm to start the year, but a roster completely devoid of star power, and a miserable W-L record quickly erased any momentum they had at the gates.



Once the White Stache HC dropped out of a playoff spot in week 13, fans quit showing up as the team struggled to win their way back into the post-season for the first time in seven seasons.



GOAT finished dead last in average attendance, but somehow managed to increase their % to capacity over their 2016-17 totals. After holding steady for a few weeks at the start of the year, the crowd sizes progressively got smaller as the season went on, as it became more and more likely that GOAT would miss the playoffs for the fourth consecutive season.

# ORAFT HINDSIGHT THE ONE THAT GOT AWAY

Draft history is fascinating, and the first thing you learn when looking through past drafts is how unpredictable the player pool is, year-in and year-out. Drafting a future star is rare -- even in the first round. Drafting a solid contributor is rare -- even in the second round. Nailing all your picks in a single draft is unheard of. It's a roll of the dice, yet the future success of each franchise depends, to a large degree, on each GMs ability to draft well.

Let's take a snapshot of all 10 franchises draft histories (post-2008), looking at their best first-round pick, a late-round gem (10th round or later) and one who got away (a superstar taken immediately after their draft position).

# DICK CHEESE

#### Best First-Round Pick:

GM Matt Cheese used his first ever 1st round pick Nathan MacKinnon, and it turned out to be the best 1st round pick in franchise history. Maybe Patrik Laine or Auston Matthews will take this crown eventually, but for now - it's MacKinnon at 1-1 in 2013

#### Late-Round Gem:

Sebastian Aho at 95th overall in 2016, and Travis Konecny at 108th overall in 2017 may evntually take the cake here, but based on the information we have to date, Dick Cheese's selection of Filip Forsberg at 147th overall in 2013 is likely the best diamond-in-the-rough uncovered by this franchise.

#### The One That Got Away:

GM Cheese drafted a 96-year-old Jaromir Jagr the pick before an up-and-coming Winnipeg Jet forward named Nikolaj Ehlers was taken. Puke. Other dubious selections include taking Alex Goligoski with the pick before William Nylander, and taking Daniel Alfredsson right before Sasha Barkov.

## HC HAYMOS

#### Best First-Round Pick:

GM Hayman has, arguably, the worst track record at drafting players in the first round in the entire league. The Martin St. Louis selection way back in '09 turned out alright. The Patrice Bergeron selection in 2017 is the best? Ok then.

#### Late-Round Gem:

HC Haymos has had better luck with picks in the 10th round or later than they have with their 1st rounders. Alex Pietrangelo and John Carlson were taken in the early 100s right before their breakouts. Mitch Marner at 150th overall in 2015 was excellent hindsight, but Artemi Panarin 9 picks before Marner is the true late round gem.

## The One That Got Away:

In 2010, HC Haymos had a chance at grabbing Jamie Benn with a 6th round pick. They made the absolute wrong call and used their 6th round selection on Michael Frolik instead. \*fart noise\*

# BRIGADE HK

#### Best First-Round Pick:

While HC Haymos' track record in the first round is ugly, Brigade HK's is super sexy. Take your pick for their best first overall pick out of John Tavares (yum), Jack Eichel (oooh baby) or Taylor Hall (schwing)

## Late-Round Gem:

The prowess of Brigade HK in the first round subdues quickly as the draft progresses, and there are slim pickings for late-round gem selections. The best late round selection by Brigade HK has to be when they took Mark Scheifele with the 98th overall selection in 2013.

#### The One That Got Away:

Some big ouchies in Brigade HK's history. In 2009, they selected Pierre-Marc Bouchard and Kris Versteeg with the picks before Joe Pavelski and Jonathan Quick were taken. They grabbed Michael Del Zotto right before PK Subban was drafted in 2010, but how about taking Tomas Hertl when Martin Jones was available before his breakout season. Oopsie doodles.

# FUNKY COLD MOLINA

#### Best First-Round Pick:

Picking Tyler Seguin in 2010 was a great choice, but the Brent Burns selection at 5th overall in 2015 was awesome. Funky Cold Molina took Pavel Datsyuk with the 4th overall pick that year: also very good. They owned the 6th overall as well. Jiri Hudler. Yeeeeeeeesh.

#### Late-Round Gem:

Funky Cold Molina's best late round gem has to be the 116th overall selection that they used on Evgeny Kuznetsov in 2015. He busted out in a big way that season with 77 points. Honorable mention goes to the 115th overall selection used on William Nylander the year before.

#### The One That Got Away:

Blake Wheeler was taken after that Jiri Hudler selection at 6th overall. 40-goal scorer Eric Staal was drafted after Molina took Bryan Little in 2017. But the worst is the selection of Jordan Staal right before Connor Hellebuyck was taken took the world by storm in 2017-18. Disgusting.

# ANCASTER VILLAGERS

## Best First-Round Pick:

The Villagers took Phil Kessel just as he was starting his ascent into hot dog and goal scoring lore, but the Braden Holtby pick at 9th overall in 2014 was the perfect buy-in time on a goalie about to finish top-5 in 3-straight Vezina trophy voting seasons.

#### Late-Round Gem:

Leon Draisaitl at 159th overall in 2014 showed the kind of foresight that three-time Fifty Mission Cup champs are made of.

## The One That Got Away:

While no team has enjoyed more success in the NHFL than the Villagers, they still have their share of draft day turds. Al Ponikarovsky and Andrei Kostitsyn over Patrice Bergeron and Tuukka Rask in '09, Alex Edler and Jonathan Drouin over Braden Holtby in '12 and '13. Or how about the 1-2 punch in 2014: first they took Steve Mason over Frederik Andersen, then decided that Dustin Brown was worth a pick over Brent Burns. Haha, loser.

# COAT

#### Best First-Round Pick:

Nico Hischier was taken 1st overall by GOAT last year, and had a successful rookie season, so we'll go with him. Runner-up mention to Martin St. Louis coming off the 2013 scoring crown.

## Late-Round Gem:

Slim-est of the slim pickings here. GOAT managed to hit on Jake Muzzin and Ryan Suter's rebound seasons in 2017-18, grabbing them at 93rd and 103rd overall, respectively. Seth Jones at 104th overall in 2016 might be the best of the bunch when we look back in a few years.

#### The One That Got Away:

Some comical selections here when you look back on them, starting in 2009: Rene Bourque taken, Claude Giroux followed. Nathan Horton taken, Drew Doughty followed. More recently, GOAT took Petr Mrazek right before Brad Marchand was taken in 2015. The Bourque-Giroux selection is probably the most egregious in league history. Blame Wes.

# STATE COLLEGE MML

#### Best First-Round Pick:

Amazingly, there are only three 1st round picks to choose from in franchise history. Of those, Taylor Hall eakes out the top honours over Corey Crawford, and both of them tower over the other 1st round pick (Jeff Skinner was brutal)

#### Late-Round Gem:

MML grabbed Dougle Hamilton in the 16th round in 2014, and took Anders Lee in the 15th round in 2016. Both great picks. But taking David Pastrnak with the 138th overall selection in 2015 was magnificent and is the best of the bunch in the franchises history.

#### The One That Got Away:

GM Sheriff had two picks in the 14th round in 2015 - the first was used on David Pastrnak. The second was used on Artem Anisimov. Artemi Panarin was taken with the pick after Anisimov. Imagine a 14th round haul of Pastrnak and Panarin - it almost happened, but GM Sheriff screwed it up.

## Best First-Round Pick:

No contest: Connor McDavid. He's 21-years-old and already has two scoring crowns. Pavelski was a solid pick back in 2010, but the clear answer to this question is McDavid. I'll stop typing now.


#### Late-Round Gem:

The Fisher Kings have stolen at least one late-round gem in each of the last three years: Nikolaj Ehlers at 145th overall in 2015, Mikko Rantanen at 147th overall in 2016, and Brayden Point at 101st overall in 2017. Major upside to all three skaters - tough to make a call as to which one is the best pick.

#### The One That Got Away:

2013 was a difficult draft for Fisher Kings, as Kari Lehtonen, Jonas Hiller, Brooks Laich and Anton Khudobin were taken over Jonathan Drouin, Brent Burns, Cam Atkinson and Filip Forsberg. But the 2015 selection of Olli Maatta over Evgeny Kuznetsov is the most hilarious choice of them all. Idiot.





# STITTSVILLE STACK

#### Best First-Round Pick:

Joe Pavelski is the best first round pick in franchise history, based on career stats. Revisit this article in a few short years, and he may have been lapped a couple times by the 2017 Clayton Keller selection.

#### Late-Round Gem:

The Stittsville Stache HC franchise is a goalie mine: Tuukka Rask at 98th overall in 2009, Jake Allen at 104th overall in 2013 - but the kicker is when they used the 158th overall selection on 40+ win Connor Hellebuyck.

## The One That Got Away:

Vadim Shipachyov was supposed to be the next Russion superstar to come back to North America and light up the NHL - a la Artemi Panarin and Alex Radulov. He did not do this. Not only did he only play 3 games, Aleksander Barkov was taken with the next pick and put up nearly a point-per-game pace. Also, taking James Wisniewski before Drew Doughty in 2014? What? But why?

# TORONTO HIGH ROLL

## Best First-Round Pick:

The Toronto High Rollers can't quit Dustin Byfuglien. They just love that big burly ball of multi-category contribution, so much so that they've used two 1st round picks on the guy. Blake Wheeler in 2015 was also a good

## Late-Round Gem:

Mike Smith at 118th overall in 2010 was a great steal, as he would go on to be a top-5 candidate for the Vezina. Drafted Kuznetsov at 114th overall in 2013, and Barkov at 142nd overall in 2014.

## The One That Got Away:

The High Rollers have a couple 1st round blunders to cry about: Corey Perry over Clayton Keller in 2017 is the most recent, but my favorite is the Pascal Leclair selection in 2009, when Pekka Rinne went immediately after. What's with the bad defenseman selections (Goligoski > Josi, Streit > Burns, Souray > Hedman)? Sven Baertschi over Jakub Voracek anyone? \*wank off motion\*

Every year, the NHL draft is a source of excitement and optimism for teams that are fortunate enough to land a pick near the top of the first round, and for the fanbases that root for those teams. Injecting a highly regarded player into any stage of a franchises development system can flip the script on an established narrative. It can be a key factor in boosting attendance, driving merchandise sales, attracting advertising dollars, and giving reason for a new generation of potential fans to tune in and see what all the fuss is about.

Now, imagine the impact that is had on actual, mega-market, super franchises - like those that compete in the hallowed NHFL.

The NHL draft has provided a steady stream of talent to the NHFL, since the NHFL's inception in 2008. The names of players taken at the top of the NHL draft are all over the Fifty Mission Cup: Drew Doughty, Victor Hedman, Evander Kane, Oliver Ekman-Larsson, Taylor Hall, Tyler Seguin, Gabriel Landeskog, Nathan MacKinnon, Patrik Laine are just a few to be taken with one of the top-5 selections in the NHL draft and subsequently lead their NHFL franchise to the promised land. It takes an expert to sort through the thousands of junior hockey players from every corner of the world, evaluate their talent levels against each other, and come up with a short list of players that have the ability (or the capability) to do what their top-ranked predecessors did before them - deliver the most sought after title, in the most prestigous organization on the planet. he final stretch drive for draft-eligible prospects, and the opportunity to wow the scouting community, is drawing to a close. Many players have had the opportunity to showcase themselves in marquee tournaments. The Ivan Hlinka Memorial, Five Nations, World Junior Championships and the U18's have provided big stages for these youngsters. Other players have had to go the hard way. Fighting their way up draft boards from more untapped regions such as New England prep schools, second tier professional circuits, and European U20 leagues. Regardless of where they play, if they shine, the hawks in the stands should have had an opportunity to get a glance.

When putting together my personal rankings, I rely a great deal on the minds and opinions of some more experienced scouts. This has been aided by countless hours of video and live viewings that I log myself. I place a great deal of emphasis on skating ability, processing skills and an ability to thrive on a consistent basis. These rankings are not intended to mimic how the draft will end up this June. It is a glimpse of how I feel the players will progress as they mature and (hopefully) experience success as NHL players.

Regarding tiers, this crop has a clear number one in Rasmus Dahlin. Behind him, Andrei Svechnikov has separated himself enough to form his own single tier. Players in the 3-9 slots would make up the third tier and likely the end of the obvious high-end talent. The fourth tier is comprised of players in the 10-20 positions who all display desirable skills and nice upsides. Tier five is a gauntlet. You could conceivably place picks 21-39 into a bucket and let a toddler pull them out at random. Tier six is your players from 40-55. Look for players 56-76 to be a nice full grouping in tier seven. Consider players in the 77-130 range to be in the arena that will have a lot of variances. One list may have a guy 30-plus spots higher than the scout next to him depending on the days they've seen them play and the assets they truly value. Each has a skill or two that is admired but also feature a troubling deficiency or three. Remember, these are approximations and not steadfast tiers written in stone. They are meant to give an indication to the levels and groupings that certain players fall into.

1. Rasmus Dahlin / LHD / 6'2 180lbs
We haven't seen a draft-eligible defender with this level of upside since Drew Doughty. Dahlin's ceiling is even higher. Effortless skating mixed with size, smarts, and dangles that would make Pavel Datsyuk nod in approval. He's the entire package and has all the tools to become a game-changing pillar for an organization. Buffalo is rightly excited.

2. Andrei Svechnikov / RW / 6'2 187lbs
Physically ready for the NHL, Svechnikov blends world-class finishing ability with hardnosed and defensively responsible play. A goal scorer who can impact the game in all
situations. A terrific blend of speed, power, and precision. He'll be a front-line threat for

3. Quinn Hughes / LHD / 5'10 174lbs

A consummate playmaker who boasts the elite speed needed to thrive at his stature. The youngest player in the NCAA this season, his confidence continued to build all season long. He was tremendous for Michigan down the stretch and looked more than capable at the World Championships. The best skater in this class and a one-man breakout machine. He can run a power play with the best of them. Needs some more pop on his shot.

#### 4. Filip Zadina / RW / 6'0 190lbs

Uses his size and strength to create space and then delivers electric moves and finishing ability. He's absolutely lethal from the circles down. A tireless worker who loves the big stage. Strong and decisive with the puck. Need a first line winger? He's

## 5. Oliver Wahlstrom / RW-C / 6'1 198lbs

Owns the best release in the class. The goal-scoring forward doesn't shy away from attacking dangerous scoring areas and boasts strong speed and quick feet. A volume-shooter who is deadly from the left circle on the power-play. Feasts on penalty killers. Terrific pure puck skills. Off to Boston College in the fall. This kid is going to score a boatload of goals in the NHL.

6. Noah Dobson / RHD / 6'3 179lbs
A right-shot defender who has all the tools to be an all-around top-four producer. Had a terrific year with Acadia-Bathurst of the QMJHL, leading them to a Memorial Cup victory. Brings high-end processing ability, soft hands and a willingness to take calculated risks. A smooth and powerful skater. Often logs 30-plus minutes a night with ease. Reminiscent of Alex Pietrangelo.

7. Jesperi Kotkaniemi / C-LW / 6'2 190lbs
Great puck skills, vision and processing skills, but skating still a work in progress. Offers a clunky stride that doesn't generate a ton of top-end power. That didn't stop him from putting up more than respectable Liiga numbers though, albeit from the wing. A strong Five Nations and U18 tournaments while playing the middle of the ice should convince scouts that's where he belongs long term. May not be flashy, but gets the job done. Appears to have the highest upside of the centres in this crop.

8. Adam Boqvist / RHD / 5'11 165lbs
Dynamic puck skills terrific vision, high-end guickness, top speed, smarts, and a

Dynamic puck skills, terrific vision, high-end quickness, top speed, smarts, and a heavy shot. His late birthday means he is just a month away from being eligible for the 2019 class further illustrating how massive his potential is. Has a big shot and loves to unload it. Concluding his season against peers at the U18's was exactly what he needed to demonstrate his elite skillset. Oozes potential but carries a touch of risk.

9. Brady Tkachuk / LW / 6'2 194lbs
The elder statesman of the 2018 crop missed last year's draft by a single day. Had an adequate season as one of the younger players in the NCAA, but his lights out World Junior showing moved the needle for many. His hands are soft, his shot is heavy and he plays an abrasive, pro-style game. He'll be a fan favourite.

## 10. Joel Farabee / LW / 5'11 148lbs

Slight and slippery, he feasts on oppositions with his vision and his finishing ability. A great skater who works tirelessly in all three zones. Had a tremendous season with the USNTDP this year. He thrived while playing with Wahlstrom and 2019-eligible super-prospect, Jack Hughes, and didn't miss a beat while anchoring his own line. Needs to add strength but does all the little things that make players successful. Can hurt the opposition during all situations. He'll add strength and that will only further his impact. Off to BU in the fall.

11. Dominik Bokk / LW-RW / 6'1 179lbs
Agile, quick hands, elusive in the offensive zone and makes a habit of landing on the
scoresheet. Big-time J20 season and received a cup of coffee in the SHL. He's just
getting started after transitioning from the German league where the quality of
competition wasn't high enough. If you like high-octane skill, you'll love Bokk.

12. Ty Smith / LHD / 5'11 176lbs
The dynamic two-way defender continued to display his full arsenal of weapons with Spokane this season. The former first overall pick in the 2015 WHL bantam draft, Smith is a tremendous skater who demonstrates poise and patience with the puck. His outlets are crisp and his head is always up. He's a player you fall in love with because he always makes the right play. Clicked at over a point-per-game this season. High ceiling and high floor – What's not to like?

asmus Kupari / C / 6'0 168lbs

Cracked the WJC roster for the Fins and did well in a secondary role. He owns high-end playmaking ability that compliments his quick and elusive style, fast and creative hands can embarrass defenders. His smaller role with a top-level Liiga team limited his overall production. Has added substantial strength this season and it hasn't slowed him down.

14. Jonatan Berggren / C-RW / 5'10 183lbs
An absolute weeking ball of a player who has been posting tremendous numbers in the
Swedish J20 circuit. Logs miles of ice as he forechecks with impunity, distributes the puck
effectively and knows how to finish as well. Terrific international performances at the Hlinka,
Five Nations and U18's offer scouts a glimpse of his skill on some big stages. He even
looked capable in a 12-game stint in the SHL. Some of the best one-on-one skills in the
class. A player his coaches love and his opponents hate

15. Evan Bouchard / RHD / 6'2 181bs

A strong puck-moving defender who took on all the tough minutes on a depleted Knights' squad. A creative player with the puck who can dart in and out of the lanes with expert
edgework, quick acceleration, and creative lines. Slight stature but enjoys engaging
physically. His talent hasn't always resulted in points but it sure jumps off the page.

18. Barrett Hayton / C / 6'1 180lbs Improved speed and strength has been the noteworthy traits in his draft season. A quality release, good vision, quick hands, and can play centre or wing. 30. Bode Wilde / RHD / 6'2 198lbs





When Cerberus HC defeated Brigade HK, by a score of 10-3, to long time elite NHFL forwards

won their long awaited first NHFL championship. Staal and Toews were drafted in the 4th and 5th rounds, respectively, in the inaugural NHFL draft in 2008, and have since gone on to be the 15th and 19th highest scoring players in NHFL history. Each player was a member of the losing team in their only other finals appearance. That it took them this long to finally hoist hockey's grail underscores the difficulty of the road to the Fifty Mission Cup. Taking past production, career longevity, elite standing at respective positions, and previous trips to the Fifty Mission Cup finals in mind, we identified the top 10 active NHFL players that have yet to win the Fifty Mission Cup

Note: Players entering at least their 10th NHFL season in 2018-19 have been included on this list. Players such as Connor McDavid, Auston Matthews, Patrik Laine, Nathan MacKinnon, Nikita Kucherov and Taylor Hali have been excluded from this list in favor of players with more experience

#### 10. Brent Burns, D

Entering 11th NHFL season, 15th NHL season Fifty Mission Cup Final Appearances: 2015, 2016

The Fisher Kings defenseman got a late start on NHFL but has still managed to put up the 5th-most points by any defenseman in NHFL history. He has 428 points in 625 games, and won the Bar Down Trophy as NHFL MVP in 2017. Burns' run of league dominance started shortly after he was traded to the Sharks in 2011, and he's the only defenseman to lead the league in shots on goal in NHFL history.

#### 9. Pekka Rinne. G

Entering 11th NHFL season, 13th NHL season Fifty Mission Cup Final Appearances: 2010, 2017

The State College MML goaltender is 310-167-66 with a .919 save percentage and 51 shutouts in 555 NHFL games, all with Nashville. He has the most wins in Predators history and ranks third in the category among active NHFL goalies. He has exceeded 40 wins three times in his NHL career (43 in 2011-12; 42 this season; 41 in 2014-15). He captured his first ever Vezina trophy this season after going 42-13-4 with a .927 save percentage and eight shutouts in 59 games. The clock is ticking on Rinne's run as a viable NHFL goaltender.

#### 8. Marc-Andre Fleury. G

Entering 11th NHFL season, 15th NHL season No Fifty Mission Cup Final Appearances

The only player on this list that has yet to even sniff a Fifty Mission Cup finals, no one has more wins in NHFL history than Marc-Andre Fleury's 328. His 37 shutouts are 7th all time. He's 4th all time in saves. He's been a keeper every year since he was originally drafted 24th overall back in 2008, including once each by three teams with a combined six Fifty Mission Cup titles. The stars have not yet aligned for the Flower, and time is running out on his relevance in the NHFL

#### 7. John Tavares. C

Entering 10th NHFL season, 10th NHL season Fifty Mission Cup Final Appearance: 2018

Tavares was the first player selected after the league's founding draft, and he finally got to his first Fifty Mission Cup final this year. The Brigade HK staple has 621 points (272 goals, 349 assists) in 669 NHFL games and has exceeded 80 points three times in his NHL career (86 in 2014-15; 84 this season; 81 in 2011-12). His point total places him 18th in NHFL history, and his goals put him 12th all time. He was a member of Brigade HK's farm when the HK made their first run to the Fifty Mission Cup finals in 2010.

#### 6. Corey Perry. RW

Entering 11th NHFL season, 14th NHL season Fifty Mission Cup Final Appearance: 2010

Despite being one of the most profilic goal scorers in league history (4th all time with 307 career scores), it's been eight years since Corey Perry has made an appearance in an NHFL final. He was drafted 5th overall in 2008, won the NHL MVP in 2011, and had been an NHFL keeper every off-season until 2017. Back in the draft for a second straight year, it seems that if Perry is going to hoist the Fifty Mission Cup, it will be as a secondary role player instead of as the star that he's been for most of his career.

#### 5. Steven Stamkos, C

Entering 11th NHFL season, 11th NHL season Fifty Mission Cup Final Appearances: 2012, 2016, 2018

Only Alex Ovechkin has more NHFL goals and goal scoring crowns than Steven Stamkos. The Brigade HK forward is 12th all time in league points, despite missing significant time due to injury in two of the league's 10

seasons. He holds the distinction of being the only one on this list to have made it to the finals three times.

#### 4. Joe Thornton. C

Entering 11th NHFL season, 21st NHL season Fifty Mission Cup Final Appearances: 2011, 2012

Despite being 11th all time in NHFL scoring (3rd in assists), Jumbo Joe hasn't participated in a Fifty Mission Cup final since 2012. Selected 7th overall in the inaugural draft, he had been bouncing back and forth between keeper designations, and top-5 round selections, before falling out of league favour for good in 2017. Entering his 21st NHL season, at this point Jumbo's best bet at a title might just be as a free agent pick up during championship week.

#### 3. Henrik Lundavist. G

Entering 11th NHFL season, 14th NHL season Fifty Mission Cup Final Appearance: 2010

The longtime Brigade HK goaltender has at least 30 wins in 8 of his 9 full NHFL regular seasons. Lundqvist first in saves (by a wide margin). It's a crime that King Henrik's only finals appearance occured in 2010, as no one has been near as consistently good in net in NHFL history. His jersey was retired in 2015, so there's still a good chance that a King Henrik jersey will be a title trophy at some point.

#### 2. Evoeni Malkin. C

Entering 11th NHFL season, 13th NHL season Fifty Mission Cup Final Appearance: 2012

9th in assists, 8th in goals and 4th in points - yet not even a finals appearance since 2012. Evgeni Malkin has a track record of experiencing untimely injuries, which may be a reason behind his name not being on the Fifty Mission Cup. Malkin has been a keeper mainstay since being drafted 3rd overall in 2008. He's the second best NHFL player to never win a championship.

#### i. Sidney Crosby. C

Entering 11th NHFL season, 14th NHL season Fifty Mission Cup Final Appearance: 2016


The all-time NHFL points leader has never won a Fifty Mission Cup. 3rd in goals, 5th in assists. Drafted 2nd overall in 2008, Crosby has been an elite keeper every year since, and yet has still come up short in his quest for ultimate NHFL glory.



Deal-making in and out of hockey has been a boon to the NHFL, most notably the \$2.2 billion sale of the Houston Rockets (NBA), the \$1.2 billion price for the Miami Marlins (MLB) and the \$500 million expansion fee paid by the NHL's Vegas Golden Knights. These three deals illustrate the willingness of buyers to pay ever-increasing revenue multiples for big-market, profitable teams (over eight times for Rockets), medium-market, money losing teams (almost six times for Marlins), and new teams in untested markets (likely over three times this season's revenue for the Knights). This willingness has transferred to the NHFL in the form of a booming league economy, with expansion on the horizon to boot. Solid team revenues (general gate, premium seating, television, advertising) and profits (excluding the two expansion fees), also boosted values. The average revenue for NHFL teams in 2017 was \$55 million higher than their NHL counterparts, reaching a staggering \$203.6 million per team.

Cerberus HC is the NHFL's most valuable team, worth \$1.58 billion. This is the 1st edition of Forbes' NHFL valuations and isn't surprising that the most decorated franchise in NHFL history takes the top spot. In 2017, Cerberus had more revenue (\$251 million) and operating income (\$94 million) than any other hockey team.

The two-time defending champion HC Haymos, worth \$1.51 billion, edged out Dick Cheese (\$1.24 billion), State College MML (\$1.23 billion) and Mr. Trade (\$1.17 billion) for second place. G.O.A.T. rounds out the 10-figure valuations (an even \$1.0 billion), while Fisher Kings and Funky Cold Molina rank 7th and 8th in the NHFL (\$910 million and \$800 million, respectively).

2008:

The decision was made part way through the first league season to maintain the NHFL as a keeper dynasty league. From there, each of the 10 General Managers made the decision to remain or remove themselves from the league. All 10 chose to remain, and the NHFL was born.

# 2010:

After two seasons in the league, GM Devon Rufenach made the decision to sell his NHFL Franchise, 'The Chiefs'. After moderate success (The Chiefs had a 221-225 record in two seasons), the franchise was sold and turned over to GM Michael Mesquita, who has led the team to six playoff appearances in the past eight years.

# 2011:

'Team Concussion' GM Mark Hayman decided to put his franchise up for sale after the 2010-2011 season. It was taken over by GM Chris White and The White Stache officially became part of the NHFL. GM Hayman finished his 3-year NHFL tenure with a 356-336 record, good for the 6th best record in league history.

## 2012:

A touch of turmoil defined the 2011-2012 season, as King Wes GM Wes Youngs made the difficult decision to step away from his GM role mid-season. David Sheriff assumed the responsibilities on an interim basis, and finished out the year. In the off-season, Chad Wood, GM

and owner of 'Wife Approved' retired from his position with the NHFL, leaving two vacant GM spots to fill.

The vacant spots are quickly claimed, first by GM Matthew Cheese, then by GM Martin Quinlan. With the demise of the aforementioned four franchises, the NHFL Original Six Era was created.

The additions of Cheese (Franchise Dick Cheese) and Quinlan (Franchise GOAT) solidified the foundation of the NHFL. Shortly after their arrival as General Managers, the league expanded to include a website and the majority of the extra-curricular features that NHFL GMs currently enjoy.

# 2018:

Six years of prosperity and positive league growth within the limits of the 10 franchises, NHFL Commissioner Michael Hayman announces the addition of two franchises, based in Grimsby and Wilsonville, that will begin play in the 2018-2019 season, bringing the NHFL to twelve teams. These are the first major professional sport teams in both Grimsby and Wilsonville. Brian Azzopardi takes over the President and General Manager duties of the Wilsonvillains, while Wes Youngs returns to his familiar roots to take up the position of CEO and General Manager for Johnny Beamsville.

The managers of both expansion teams plan to work alongside the more established franchises to continue to build an NHFL league and brand that will continue to stand the test of time, and differentiate itself from the rest of the fantasy sport universe.

# PROTECTED AND UNPROTECTED LISTS

- Each current NHFL team will finish the season with a maximum roster size of 23 players + IR+ players (26 players total). This group of players for each NHFL team shall herein be referred to as 'Roster Players'
- NHFL GMs may selection up to 15 of their 'Roster Players' to protect from selection in the 2018 Expansion Draft. Any player not included on these lists will be eligible to be drafted by either expansion team in the Expansion Draft.
- Existing NHFL GMs shall submit their list of protected roster players to the Commissioner's office no later than June 8, 2018.
- Protected lists (and the resulting unprotected lists) will be posted on the NHFL.ca website on June 9, 2018
- Protected lists shall included players that you intend to select as your keepers. Do not advertise which players you are projecting to keep until after the expansion trading window (see below)

# TRADING WINDOW PRIOR TO THE 2018 EXPANSION DRAFT

- Once the lists of protected roster players are posted, a two-week window wherein the expansion teams are free to make trades with existing NHFL franchises, will
- Existing NHFL teams are permitted to trade one (1) player, from their list of protected roster players, to an expansion team
- Existing and expansion franchises shall keep confidential all trades (with the exception of privately notifying the Commissioner of a completed trade). Trades shall be announced during the Expansion Draft.
- Only players from the protected roster player lists, and farm teams are eligibile to be traded during this window by the existing NHFL franchises.
- Expansion teams may trade away keeper and farm spots during this window. The keeper and farm spots will not apply to any roster until after the 2018 NHFL draft.
- All trades must be privately reported to the Commissioner prior to the close of the two-week trading window.
- Trades involving draft picks must have an identical number of draft picks being transferred to each team involved in the trade.
- Once the trading window is closed, existing NHFL teams may select their lists of keeper players from the remaining 14 or 15 players on their protected list.

# 2018 EXPANSION DRAFT

- The expansion teams will participate in a two-team, six round, snaking draft on July 7, 2018 to each select their list of players to enter the 2018 off-season with.
- Only players left unprotected by existing NHFL teams, and players on the free agent/waiver list will be eligible to be selected as drafted players in the expansion draft
- Players selected in the 2018 NHL Draft, KHL players that signed an NHL contract in 2018, and other players that are not under NHL contract and did not play in the NHL in 2017-2018 will not be eligible for selection in the NHFL expansion draft.
- Once an existing team loses a player either via trade with an expansion team, or having an expansion team select a player from their unprotected list - their protected and unprotected players are removed from the pool of players that are eligible to be acquired by either expansion team.
- (i.e. if Dick Cheese trades a player from their protected list to an expansion team during the trade window, they are no longer permitted to make anymore trades during the window, and the expansion teams will no longer be permitted to select a player from Dick Cheese's list of unprotected players)
- Players acquired by the expansion teams via trade will replace expansion draft selections, starting with the lowest selection (i.e. if 3 players are acquired via trade by an expansion team, that expansion team will forfeit their last 3 selections in the **Expansion Draft)**

These rules will be in place until the completion of the 2018 NHFL Draft

# **KEEPERS**

Each team starts with 7, and is permitted to have no fewer than 5 at any one time. Teams may acquire as many keeper spots as they would like, but no more than 9 will apply over an off-season

### **FARM SPOTS**

Games played eligibility limits are exceeded pmce a player plays 10 or more games in 3 seasons (at the conclusion of the season in which this limit is reached)


It was a long time running before the Wilsonvillains were admitted into the NHFL as part of the 2018 expansion from ten to twelve total franchises. GM Brian Azzopardi had been privately campaigning to a number of individual GMs for at least four years before that fateful September Saturday around the wood stove in the living room of the Kawagama Lake cottage, when a detailed expansion discussion was held, a vote was taken, and the league spoke. 
GM Azzopardi quickly got to work on developing their franchises marketing strategy. The 'Wilsonvillains' team name was a natural choice for the franchise. Azzopardi, a lifelong hockey fan and seasoned fantasy hockey GM, had adopted the name on another franchise that he managed, with successful results. It seemed only fitting to christen his first real hockey franchise with the same title. From there, construction started on the State-of-the-Art THC Gardens, home arena for the Wilsonvillains. With construction being completed and the grand opening happening well ahead of schedule, the

Wilsonvillains are capitalizing on the honeymoon buzz the new team has created in the greater Wilsonville area.

Like any typical expansion team, the Wilsonvillains are behind the 8-ball, in comparison to most of the established NHFL franchises, when it comes to NHL talent, both on their big league roster, and in their prospect pipeline. However, it's difficult to envision an off-season for an expansion team that yielded even more returns that what GM Ázzopardi was able to secure. GM Azzopardi's first move during the two-week expansion draft trade window was to lock down the crown jewel of this year's class of non-keepers: Claude Giroux. Giroux had a renaissance season, finishing second in league scoring with a career high 102 points. GM Azzopardi didn't stop there, as he proceeded to land other coveted players, projected to go in the first couple rounds of the draft, in young center Aleksander Barkov, and electric high-octane defensemen P.K. Subban and Shayne Gostisbehere. The Wilsonvillains capped it all off by acquiring depth in goal, swinging one final move during the trade window to bring in the legendary Henrik Lundqvist.

GM Azzopardi pounced early and often during the trade window to beef up their player calibre entering their first NHFL season. Their current group gives them an outside shot at building a team that could surprise in 2018-19. If the Wilsonvillains struggle, then at the very least they've managed to acquire a number of valuable assets that could be flipped for quite a profit as the trade deadline approaches, next spring. Either way, their hard work is positioned to pay off handsomely.





SEASONOPREVIEW

More than just a majestic mustache, GM Brian Azzopardi's trading skills and acumen were on full display as soon as they were allowed to be. The trading window was only a few hours old when the Wilsonvillains swung a number of deals. It wasn't until the expansion draft - hosted at THC Gardens, home arena for the Wilsonvillains - until the league learned the full magnitude of the players that were acquired. Two players (Giroux and Barkov) that finished in the top-25 in scoring in 2017-18, two defenders (Subban and Ghostisbehere) that finished in the top-10 in defensemen scoring in 2017-18, and a workhorse goaltender (Lundqvist) that has a long history of being able to carry an NHFL team over short stretches, on his own. The future is now for the Wilsonvillains, and even if they don't compete in 2018-19, watch out for this franchise in 2020 and beyond.

an asset that they deemed valuable, while focusing on not sacrificing significant draft capital in order to do so. GM Youngs navigated the trade window on his own terms and dictated the pace of the game, using nearly all 14 days to procure their transactions. Ultimately, Johnny Beamsville managed to swing three deals ahead of the expansion draft, pulling in the recently shipped-to-Arizona post-hype sleeper Alex Galchenyuk, the talented but enigmatic Jordan Eberle, and the time-tested, consistently consistent Mike Smith. With their 3 selections in the expansion draft, Johnny Beamsville brought Dougie Hamilton, Sam Reinhart and Mikko Koivu into the fray to pair up with their trade acquisitions, and form a group of solid, if unspectacular, veterans around which to build their roster.

While their starting keeper group may not have the same flash or name recognition as their expansion team counterpart, the flip side to that equation is mostly untouched cupboard of draft picks or the coming fall draft. Throughout his first turn as an NHFL GM, there were two skills that GM Youngs consistently displayed. The est was a propensity to be able to pull the

trigger on any deal that improved his roster in the short term. This ability to follow through on stressful personnel decisions directly led to league titles in 2009 and 2010. The second evident skill that the league witnessed was an uncanny ability to dig up diamonds in the rough in the later rounds of the draft -Anze Kopitar, Milan Lucic were two of the more notable names they picked up in the 2008 and 2009 championship seasons - both in the 9th round. However, their 2010 draft in Hamilton was the stuff of legends: Corey Crawford in the 4th, Erik Karlsson in the 5th, P.K. Subban in the 7th and T.J. Oshie in the 8th. Another haul like that in the Ottawa draft, and this could be roster that is competing for another Fifty Mission Cup sooner, rather than later.

There is a lot of work to do before this franchise gets to that point, though. The group of players that Johnny Beamsville has heading into the draft is, arguably, one of the weakest in the history of the NHFL. On a pure managerial skill level, GM Youngs once hung with the best of 'em in the NHFL. and will be out to prove that he's still got it.

# INAUGURAL NHFL SEASON IN 2018-2019

Welcome back, the 2012 Beamsville. With split from the NHFL firmly in the rearview mirror, GM Wes Young's finds himself in the ownership position of a National Hockey Fantasy League team once again. However, this is not league that they were once the two-time champion of. Roster sizes, scoring categories, trade and free agency dynamics have changed drastically since then, the skill of the leagues' General Managers has increased ten-fold, and the on-ice product of the NHL is in the middle of it's own evolution. Technically, this is a return, but in many

Johnny ways this is a new endeavor into a mostly unrecognizable league.

The first experience of the new endeavor - after the franchise logo design and branding - was taking the important steps to position themselves for future success. The two-week, expansion trade window was the initial opportunity that GM Youngs was presented with in order to begin to work towards this. GM Youngs approached the trade window with trepidation, and made a strategic decision to hold their cards close to their chest, remain patient in trade negotiations, and only pounce on offers that would bring in

It's not necessarily pretty, but the players that Johnny Beamsville has going into the Ottawa draft are serviceable, and come with obvious upsides. A new start in the desert for Galchenyuk could untap the potential that made him #3 overall selection in the 2012 NHL draft. Lining up next to super-rookie Mathew Barzal could shoot Eberle back into point-per-game territory. Reinhart's stellar run in the second half last year could translate into a 70+ point season. Mike Smith could turn back the clock and perform in-line with his Vezina trophy finalist days. GM Wes Youngs managed to bring in enough potential to make the coming season interesting well before it gets underway, however, struggles in the short term are expected, even if the above-listed scenarios are realized. The build begins here, and GM Youngs did a solid job in squeezing value out of the expansion draft process.



# AN EARLY LOOK AT THE 2019 NHL DRAFT CLAS

The scouting season never really ends. It takes a little pause at the NHL Draft in late June every year. That extends until the World Junior Summer

Showcase and Ivan Hlinka tournament kick off in early August. The five-week reprieve is just enough time to sift through the countless video dips, notes and reports that have been compiled on draft-minus one players from the previous year to begin to get a semblance of a ranking in order.

It seems like I've been keeping a closer eye on the 2019 crop than normal years. That may have to do with how much of The Program I've viewed as well as the talent that the Western Hockey League is fortunate enough to have in this class. Needless to say, I'm quite high on this group of players. It's a strong draft.

For the Preliminary Rankings, I normally stick to the first round and throw a handful of Honourable Mentions in. This year I've extended that to a top 62 with a fistful of Honourable Mentions.

As always, my assessments are limited. I am but one man who also has a three-year-old son, a teaching career, and writing commitments. However, I'm fortunate enough to have a patient wife and some more experienced scouts to bounce things off of. I've had eyes on each of the players listed. If I haven't been able to get a firm grip on a player yet (which can frequently be the case at this point of the process), that player may sit further down then they eventually will after some more viewings.

This is not intended to mock up what the selections will end up as next June. This is how I perceive the player today in conjunction with how I believe they'll progress and develop. Once again, I'm limited to on-ice products as well. Knowing these young men as individuals would be telling towards their drive and determination. Something that cannot be understated.

Regarding my method, I place immense value on skating ability and processing skills. Physical attributes are great, but if you can't see the play develop or recognize your options quickly, both offensively and defensively, you'll be destined for an uphill battle. It's hard not to love a creative player with slick puck skills. But those attributes come after the speed and smarts.

Regarding tiers, like 2018, this class has a clear-cut number one. Jack Hughes stands alone. Just like 2018, this class has a clear number two heading into the season. Kaapo Kakko has done enough to separate himself from his peers and hold the bride's maid position.

1. Jack Hughes

The highest producing U17 player in USNTDP history, Hughes is electrifying. His skating, puck skills, and creativity are dynamic and dangerous for opposing defenders. He brings the intelligence and talent combination that can change the landscape of a game in a flash. Despite not being a large player, he refuses to stay to the perimeter. With added strength, he'll be able to handle that style even better. A franchise-altering player.

2. Kaapa Kakko

The Patrik Laine to Hughes' Matthews. If this was a different year, the Finnish winger would be sitting pretty in the pole position. Kaapo blends size, speed, finishing ability and terrific vision. Soft touch for a big man. Massive upside as a complete point-producing winger. He'll be a front-line scoring threat for years to come.

3. Bowen Byram

An explosive skater who can act as a one-man breakout. He blends his terrific acceleration and north-south speed with lateral edge work and play creation through the neutral zone. Owns a heavy shot that is effective in all situations. Continues to improve his gap control and defensive awareness. Can get caught at times, but you take the good with the bad. An efficient power play quarterback in the making.

4. Alex Turcotte

Overshadowed by Hughes at The Program, Turcotte has across-the-board talent. Great offensive instincts, quick acceleration and is already a deft two-way player. A constant battler. Another player with first-line upside. He'll be a great consolation prize for a lottery loser.

5. Dylan Cozens
A long, powerful stride drives his elite speed. He's a complete player with skill to burn in a sizable frame. He owns an accurate release and uses that threat to look-off defenders and slide crisp passes into his mate's wheelhouses. Loves to win one-on-one battles. Smart. A potential 1C.
